# Construction Starting Also Means More Work Ahead

"The Phase I construction contract is in legal review and expected to be signed by the end of April, with work starting in early May" reports John Farrell, SSWay's Executive Director. "We have selected Don Luchetti Construction, Inc. of Melbourne for this horizontal construction phase," meaning preparing the land, building underground utilities, water retention areas, roads, parking, sidewalks, and fences. "We also learned in early March that all construction costs have increased 30 percent due to scarcity of materials attributed to the pandemic," John explains. "Therefore, we updated our budget and changed from four phases to five."

Phase I will take through the end of 2021 to complete. In early 2022, Phase 2 will begin construction of the Community Center, one six-unit apartment building and one three-unit apartment building. "We will begin moving families into the apartments as soon as they are completed," says John. From April through December 2022, Phases 3 to 5 will build the remaining six apartment buildings. This means the entire campus should be complete and all 40 family apartments occupied in early 2023. So, the "More Work Ahead" is in large part the Fundraising Campaign.

# Fundraising Expands with Grants and Giving Channels

Tony Catanese never stops. "The big thing we're working is the \$250,000 Challenge Grant." The "challenge" is getting donors to match all \$250,000 so SSWay will received a total of \$500,000, which would cover the remaining costs for Phase I construction. "We are collecting a lot of matching gifts," Tony says "and will continue work this through summer." In another effort, Tony is working with potential major donors to SSWay and is happy about that progress, as well.

Also, Tony and John Farrell report that the United Way of Brevard and Catholic Foundation in Orlando approved SSWay for donations. Donors to these organizations can now designate SSWay to receive their funds.

Just 2 months ago, SSWay started a Grants Working Group. "There are just two of us right now," says Karen Eisenhauer, "me and Cyndi Chanou" (pronounced hah-noo). Karen retired from Eastern Florida State College where she worked with students who found school difficult. "I'm familiar with what happens to people who struggled in school when they were younger, so I was appalled at the num-

ber of homeless schoolchildren in Brevard." One of Karen's first full-time jobs at college was writing grant reports. Cyndi retired 2 years ago from teaching elementary school and wondered what God might like her to do next. "I prayed about it and SSWay kind of fell into my lap!" Cyndi is new to grant writing but has learned a great deal.

Their job is to scour the universe for grant opportunities and apply. "We've submitted seven grants so far. I'll have another submitted this week, and Cyndi is working one now, too." This is the real grunt work of grant writing. "We've submitted grants applications for a total of a quarter million dollars, but we have no idea yet what we might be awarded." Lately it has become harder to find new grant opportunities that SSWay can apply to. "We have some

Phase I costs (\$1.7M) should be covered by the end of this summer. Phases 2 to 5 total \$5.5M and are to be completed in 2022. John Farrell has been looking ahead. "The Florida Housing Finance Corporation told us that SSWay is a good candidate for at least \$2.8M in grants in 2022; we'll apply early next year." John is working other funding sources, as well. tions to teach skilled trades, and some companies will hire even without formal training and provide on the job training. "HBCA is happy to work with Saint Stephen's Way to see how we can best serve wherever we can." This means family members in SSWay's program will have opportunities to learn trades and gain skills for better employment opportunities. "As I learn more about SSWay's specific plans and what's already been done, I can better determine ways the HBCA can help."

John Farrell is also excited. "We now have four partners on board to recommend families for SSWay and provide case management services for them during their stay with us." Catholic Charities, Brevard Family Partnership, Brevard C.A.R.E.S., and Eckerd Connects are all going to be coordinating with each other to provide these important services for the benefit of our resident families. SSWay continues building its critical partnerships support base!




#### **Our Mission**

#### Campaign to Build Saint Stephen's Way




St. Stephen's Way will have 40, 3-bedroom, 2 bath apartments; community center; and caretaker's residence. The cost to build this community is projected at \$13,631,880. As of March 31, 2021, more than \$7,644,494 in donations and in-kind support had been raised, and fundraising for the remainder is ongoing. Groundbreaking occurred on March 2, 2021 with site development to be complete in November 2021. Construction of the Holman Community Center and the first 9 apartments will immediately follow with a planned completion date in February 2022. The remaining residential buildings are set for completion by December 2022.

Homeless families are sleeping in cars, also have access to many supportive services from partetc. For example, Brevard Health Alliance will provide medical services. With the aid of these programs and services, we will help families build a more sustainable and successful future.

will assist them in developing the skills necessary to be- To obtain a lease, families must be employed and able to pass drug and background checks. Saint Stephen's Way apartments will rent for 30% of the family income, with a minimum of \$600.00 a month. Apartments are 1,100 sq. ft. in size and leases range from 8 to 24 months. SSW is designed to be a financially self-sustaining, 501(c)3 corporation, with no debt.
